WHAT ARE OER?

Educational resources (text, video, audio, etc.) that explicitly allow free use, (re-)distribution, duplication, and modification.

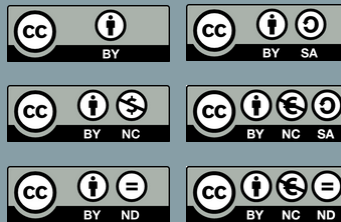

CREATIVE COMMONS LICENSES

There are six license types with different degrees of usage restrictions. The two licenses with the fewest restrictions are recommended for OER: **CC BY** (Attribution) and **CC BY SA** (Attribution & Share Alike).

Don't forget the license version!

LICENSE COMPONENTS (TASL RULE)

- Title of the work: What is the name of the work?
- Author(s): Who allows you to use the work?
- Source: Where can people find the work?
- License + license version: How can you use the work?

CREATING AND COMBINING

- Create an original work (own authorship)
- Don't use copyrighted materials or other licensed works (e.g. Pixabay)
- Combine OER with each other or mix them with your own material
- Pay attention to the compatibility of the CC licenses
- Select appropriate license and license version
- Make OER available for others publicly (e.g. on specific repositories) so they can be found
